

Troyer Horizontal Gourd with Tunnel Entrance

Features:

Tunnel is attached to the Troyer Horizontal Gourd.

The black rubber traction is installed right up to the tunnel entrance.

1/8" between bottom of porch and Conley II entrance.

Tunnel has a deeply ribbed porch

Also available with Round entrance

Trap Compatible



Hanging the Troyer Horizontal Gourd with Tunnel entrance is easy when using a Gourd Mounting Arm, or the horizontal gourd hanging arm. Troyer Gourds have a 3/8 hanging tube so there is no need to enlarge the hanging tube when using either Gourd Mounting Arms or the gourd hanging arms. All Troyer Gourds hang using the horizontal arm option.

When hanging gourds using the Gourd Mounting Arms you can mount the GMA in 2 ways. One will place your gourd further out and one will place the gourd further back.



Always add several handfuls of pine needles to the Troyer gourds.

Extra Tidbits

I love the Troyer Gourds and so do my martins, but like all gourds there are things we landlords can do to “improve” the gourd. Here is what I do with mine.

Caps from **any** manufactured gourd can fall off and never at a good time, so I have begun wrapping electrical tape on the threads of the gourd. Since doing this no caps have fallen off.

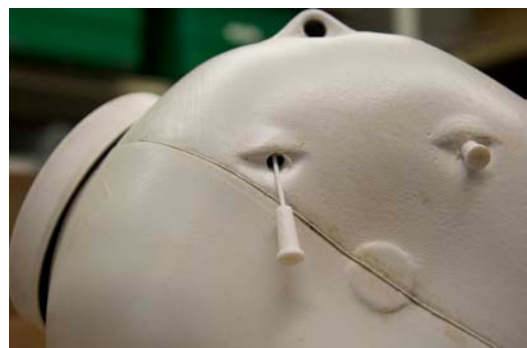
Add cap liners. Liners darken the interior of gourds. Adding a liner is simple, remove the white liner, install the black novathene liner and place the white liner on top.



Trap Compatible. The tunnel entrance has a very effective optional trap.



Vent Plugs. All Troyer gourds have built in vent canopies. Drill the vent canopy using a ¼” drill bit. Purchase the optional vent hole plugs and insert the T-shaped end of the vent plug into the hole and push the plug into the hole. When the warm weather arrives remove the plug from the hole and let the plug hang down the gourd. Should cool wet weather hit you simply plug the hole.
